Children Grow and Change Every Day

Through the Help Me Grow program, the Ages & Stages Questionnaire (ASQ) is a free, simple tool you can use to find out what your child's strengths are, and the areas where they may need more practice. The program is designed specifically for the age of your child anywhere between birth and 5 ½ years old, and can be done multiple times during your child's first five years of life. Simply complete a Questionnaire in the comfort of your home, then submit it to us for scoring. We'll let you know the results, help you with next steps, if needed, and provide you with fun, simple activities to help with your child's continual growth and development - all for FREE! Happy, relaxed parents have more to give to their children!

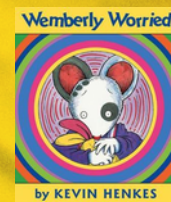

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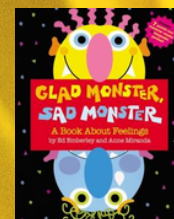

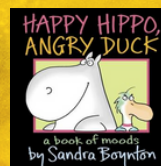

FREE car seats!

MA state law requires all children under 8 years old and less than 57 inches tall to be properly fastened in a federally approved car seat or booster seat. If your family is on MassHealth through Boston Medical Center's HealthNet Plan, you may be eligible for a free car seat.
